



FUND OBJECTIVE & PRINCIPAL INVESTMENT STRATEGIES

The ICON Healthcare Fund seeks long-term capital appreciation. It uses a quantitative methodology to identify securities ICON believes are underpriced relative to value. It normally invests at least 80% of its net assets, plus any borrowings for investment purposes, in equity securities of companies in the Health Care sector (as determined by the Global Industry Classification Standard). Equity securities in which the Fund may invest include common stocks and preferred stocks of companies of any market capitalization. This strategy may not be changed unless the Fund shareholders are given at least 60 days' prior notice.

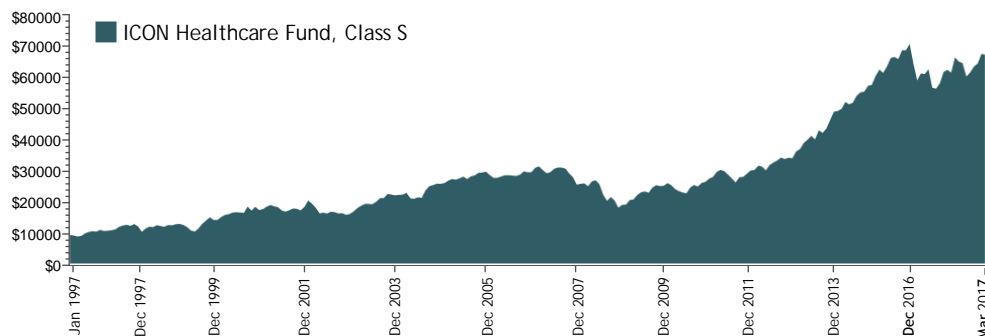

Gross Expenses are all customary expenses incurred by a Fund, excluding, where applicable, waivers, reimbursements, and contractually agreed-to limits of the total expenses by the Fund's adviser. Net Expenses are all customary expenses incurred by a Fund, including, where applicable, waivers, reimbursements, and contractually agreed-to limits of the total expenses by the Fund adviser.
